# Storm Sentinel<sup>®</sup> Curb Inlet Filter

# Curb Inlet Only with Weighted Bags



### Installation (weighted bags are required):

- Position the filter coil (4346) against the curb inlet. The edges of the coil should extend beyond the opening on both sides.
- 2. The skirt is not required and can be removed or wrapped around the filter coil.
- 3. Position weighted filter bags (4345-BX2, sold separately), or other weights (such as sandbags), on each end of the coil. ENPAC weighted bags are secured with hook and loop strips.
- Check that there are no gaps between the coil and the ground. Add more weight if necessary to ensure effective filtration.

#### Removal:

- 1. Lift and remove the coil and weighted bags.
- 2. Dispose of contaminated Storm Sentinels<sup>®</sup> according to all local, state and federal regulations. Contact your local disposal authority for more information.
- 3. Replace and install new filter.

# Curb & Drop Inlet



### Installation (weighted bags are not required):

- 1. Remove catch basin grate.
- 2. Remove dirt and debris from grate and basin edges.
- Position the filter coil (4346) against the curb inlet. The edges of the coil should extend beyond the opening on both sides.
- 4. Position the skirt to the end of the catch basin.
- 5. Reinstall grate. To ensure maximum effectiveness, fabric of filter should be fully captured between grate and edge of basin.
- 6. If desired, use a utility knife to cut excess fabric around the grate.
- For full filtration of the combination drain (curb and drop inlet), pair the Curb Inlet Filter (4346) with a Catch Basin Insert (4320), or purchase a one-piece combo version, the Curb Basin Insert (4320-CURB).

## Removal:

- 1. Remove catch basin grate.
- 2. Lift and remove the filter.
- Dispose of contaminated Storm Sentinels<sup>®</sup> according to all local, state and federal regulations. Contact your local disposal authority for more information.
- 4. Replace and install new filter.
